

DEUTERONOMY – REVIEWING FOR THE TEST

I. Remember 1-4

A. REMEMBER giving the Law. “Only take heed to thyself, and **keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen**, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life: but **teach them thy sons, and thy sons’ sons**; *Specially* **THE DAY THAT THOU STOODEST BEFORE THE LORD THY GOD IN HOREB**, when the LORD said unto me, **Gather me the people together, and I will make them hear my words, that they may learn to fear me all the days that they shall live** upon the earth, and *that* they may teach their children.” (Deuteronomy 4:9-10)

B. REMEMBER the Covenant. “**Take heed unto yourselves, lest ye forget the covenant of the LORD your God, which he made with you**, and make you a graven image, or the likeness of any *thing*, which the LORD thy God hath forbidden thee.” (Deuteronomy 4:23)

C. REMEMBER Slavery. “And **remember that thou wast a servant** in the land of Egypt, and *that* the LORD thy **God brought thee out thence through a mighty hand** and by a stretched out arm: **therefore the LORD thy God commanded thee to keep the sabbath day.**” (Deuteronomy 5:15)

D. REMEMBER Redemption. “Thou shalt not be afraid of them: *but* shalt well **remember what the LORD thy God did unto Pharaoh**, and unto all Egypt;” (Deuteronomy 7:18)

E. REMEMBER Providence. “And thou shalt **remember all the way which the LORD thy God led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee**, to know what was in thine heart, whether thou wouldest keep his commandments, or no. And **he humbled thee, and suffered thee to hunger, and fed thee with manna, which thou knewest not, neither did thy fathers know; that he might make thee know that man doth not live by bread only, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of the LORD doth man live.** Thy raiment waxed not old upon thee, neither did thy foot swell, these forty years. Thou shalt also consider in thine heart, that, **as a man chasteneth his son, so the LORD thy God chasteneth thee. Therefore thou shalt keep the commandments** of the LORD thy God, to walk in his ways, and to fear him.” (Deuteronomy 8:2-6)

F. REMEMBER Sin. “Remember, **and forget not, how thou provokedst the LORD thy God to wrath** in the wilderness: from the day that thou didst depart out of the land of Egypt, until ye came unto this place, **ye have been rebellious** against the LORD.” (Deuteronomy 9:7)

G. REMEMBER Punishment. “**Remember what the LORD thy God did unto Miriam** by the way, after that ye were come forth out of Egypt.” (Deuteronomy 24:9)

H. REMEMBER Redemptive History. “**Remember the days of old**, consider the years of many generations: ask thy father, and **he will shew thee; thy elders, and they will tell thee.**” (Deuteronomy 32:7)

II. Review Doctrine 5-11

“Hear, O Israel: **The LORD our God is one LORD: And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a**

sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates. And it shall be, when the LORD thy God shall have brought thee into the land which he swore unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give thee great and goodly cities, which thou buildedst not, And houses full of all good *things*, which thou filledst not, and wells digged, which thou diggedst not, vineyards and olive trees, which thou plantedst not; when thou shalt have eaten and be full;” (Deuteronomy 6:4-11)

III. Interpret and Apply the Law through Case Laws 12-26

IV. Count the Cost – LIFE AND DEATH 27-30

A. God, not some man or culture, established the rules underlying life. “And *what nation is there so great, that hath statutes and judgments so righteous as all this law, which I set before you this day?*” (Deuteronomy 4:8)

B. The Bible is about life and death. “Behold, *I set before you this day a blessing and a curse; A blessing, if ye obey* the commandments of the LORD your God, which I command you this day: *And a curse, if ye will not obey* the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside out of the way which I command you this day, to go after other gods, which ye have not known.” (Deuteronomy 11:26-28)

C. There are no secrets. “I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, *that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live:*” (Deuteronomy 30:19)

V. Take Theology Personally 31-34

“And now, Israel, *what doth the LORD thy God require of thee, but to fear the LORD thy God, to walk in all his ways, and to love him, and to serve the LORD thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul, To keep the commandments of the LORD, and his statutes, which I command thee this day for thy good?*” (Deuteronomy 10:12-13)
